This week, I'm pleased to join with our American Indian Program and our Office of Equity, Inclusion and Diversity in celebrating Indigenous Peoples' Day. This holiday was signed into law here in New Mexico by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham in 2019 and is celebrated by many in the United States to honor the diverse cultures and histories of the Indigenous peoples of our land.

New Mexico is home to 23 Native American nations, pueblos and tribes, and those communities and their rich cultural heritage are a beautiful aspect of our state's identity. Indigenous Peoples' Day offers all of us an opportunity to honor their important place in our cultural identity. It also provides a moment to reflect on our complex and sometimes difficult shared history in this place.

Across the NMSU system, we are working to strengthen our relationships with tribal communities and seeking to understand how we can best engage and support them through our research and outreach work.

On the Las Cruces campus, we're honoring and celebrating Indigenous Peoples' Week with events aimed at building community. If you missed the opening events, you can still take part in a beading workshop, a movie night, dinner featuring flavors of the Pueblo of Laguna and line dance lessons with Miss Native American NMSU.
